









## FLEAS

### Pre-treatment preparation sheet

#### Before we visit

Please ensure the following actions are completed prior to the pest controller arriving on the day of your appointment.

These actions are required in order for the pest controller to be able to carry out an effective treatment. If these preparations are not completed, the pest controller will be unable to carry out the treatment.

-  Remove all items from the floor areas of each room to be treated.
-  All furniture should be moved from the edges of the room to allow access to the floor wall junctions.
-  All carpets and rugs should be hoovered thoroughly and any carpet free areas should be cleaned. Pay particular attention to areas where pets sleep and where the sun may heat an area of flooring. Empty the hoover directly into the dustbin or change the bag after cleaning.
-  Ensure any pet bedding is washed and their beds cleaned thoroughly.
-  If you have a pet make sure it is being treated with an approved formulation, preferably via a vet.
-  People and all pets must leave the room being treated and not be allowed back in until the insecticide is dry.

#### After our visit

Do not enter the treated rooms for at least two hours or until otherwise advised by the pest controller.

Do not Hoover carpets for at least 14 days to allow the insecticide time to work.

NOTE: One treatment is usually enough to control the infestation as the products used carry on working for some weeks. The fleas should die off gradually after coming into contact with the insecticide. If there is still a problem 14 days after the original treatment, please get in touch to arrange a re-treat.
